Announcing Rescheduled Live MCLE on Trial Skills: Tuesday October 3, 2017

In partnership with the State Bar of Texas, the Children's Commission will present two live webcasts on basic and advanced trial skills in CPS cases. The total MCLE is six hours, which includes .75 hours of ethics.

Preparing Your CPS Case for Trial: Position Yourself to Win will cover the following topics: case strategy and preparation, including discussion of successful themes and theories; how to build a CPS Trial Notebook; and identifying, designating, preparing and presenting your witnesses. Also discussed will be how to handle evidentiary matters, including tips and traps for the CPS practitioner on laying the foundation for various exhibits and on making and responding to common objections. Additionally, there will be a judicially-led advocate panel on preparing for Voir Dire in CPS Cases.

3.0 hours of MCLE, with .50 hours of ethics credit. Tuesday, October 3, 2017 from 9:30 am to 12:40 pm.

Basic and Advanced Trial Skills in CPS Litigation: Persuade and Prevail will cover the following topics: basic information and advanced tips regarding trial advocacy in the CPS Case, including crafting your opening statement; conducting successful direct and cross examinations, impeachment, and closing argument. Additionally, presentations on how to qualify and disqualify experts and using high level cross examination to your advantage with opposing counsel's exhibits will round out this MCLE with advanced practical skills for all practitioners on the CPS docket.

If you previously registered for either or both of these webcasts, you should have received an email from Texas Bar CLE with information about the transfer of your registration to the rescheduled date. If you applied for a discount or a scholarship from the State Bar or from the Commission, your application will transfer with your registration to the rescheduled date.

If you would like to register for either or both of the above webcasts, please note the following. Each program will have a different CLE number, so viewers will need to register and pay separately for each webcast. Viewer discounts are available for qualifying attorneys upon registration. The full cost of each CLE is \$180. Please note that the following discounts are available upon registration:

- Judges' staff attorneys can register for free.
- Court-appointed attorneys currently taking cases on the CPS docket can receive a \$155 discount per webcast from TexasBarCLE, bringing the cost to \$25.
- Discounts are not available through TexasBarCLE to prosecutors who represent the State or DFPS. However, any prosecutor who cannot afford to pay or whose employer cannot pay the full cost of the webcast may apply for one of two scholarships:

1. A scholarship through the Children's Commission, where the applicant pays for the full cost of the webcast to TexasBarCLE and then is reimbursed a total of \$155, bringing the cost per webcast to \$25. 2. A scholarship through the State Bar of Texas where the applicant agrees to pay whatever amount she or he can afford for a webcast. This scholarship form is available on the [TexasBarCLE MCLE registration page](#).
