All hearings currently scheduled today through March 26, 2020 will proceed as scheduled with the following caveats:

1. In CPS cases, the Department is relieved of the obligation to transport children to Court. Therefore no children who are subject of CPS suits will attend Court. If the Attorney Ad Litem for child learns the child desires to appear by phone, please advise the Court and parties and make arrangements for the child's appearance by phone.
2. The March 23, 2020 Jury Panel is being cancelled, however the attorneys and defendants are required to appear to reschedule the jury trial date and/or handle the matter as otherwise scheduled.
3. No new cases will be added/set/scheduled to the 336th District Courts dockets until April 1, 2020 unless the case is one of the following:
 - A. CPS removals
 - B. Juvenile Detention hearings
 - C. Protective Order hearings and Temporary Restraining Orders
 - D. Inmate cases who intend to resolve their case by plea

Please continue to file cases electronically with the District Clerk's office as those services are not affected by this notice. The 336th District Court remains open regular business hours. The Judge remains available for law enforcement to review warrants and for the Department should any removals arise.

The measures are intended to limit the number of people in the Courtroom consistent w/CDC recommendations.

Additionally, the 336th District Court will continue to be available to schedule or reschedule cases as needed and can be reached by phone, email or in person.

Please contact the Court if you have questions or concerns. Additional information about potential changes to 336th District Court dockets after April 1, 2020 will be forthcoming.
