

These public photo exhibits feature children eligible for adoption in their own communities. **Heart Galleries tell a child's story, capturing each child's spirit, individuality, interests, and unique needs**. The galleries generate awareness and advocacy for these youth while promoting adoption into local homes, helping children stay connected to the communities they know.



Texas has committed \$24 million to expand the Heart Gallery model across the state and provide extensive post-adoption support and training statewide to promote family well-being. When children in the system are cared for by families formed through adoption, kinship, and/or guardianship, the Heart Galleries will provide those families with the support needed to prevent youth from re-entering the system.
